



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
Arab Land Initiative

Good land governance, functioning land administration, and protection of housing, land and property rights are critical for the social, economic, and environmental sustainability of the Arab region and for the realisation of the human rights of all women, men, and children.

The Arab Land Initiative was established in 2016 to catalyse such positive changes. Under the leadership of UN-Habitat and the Global Land Tool Network, the Initiative empowers regional land champions through coordination, collaboration, capacity, knowledge, and information sharing.

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The UNECE Committee on Urban Development, Housing and Land Management (CUDHLM)

The work of the Committee on Urban Development, Housing and Land Management is based on principles and objectives of key United Nations policy documents on housing and urban development, including, the <u>Geneva UN</u> <u>Charter on Sustainable Housing</u> and <u>Place and Life in the ECE – A Regional</u> <u>Action Plan 2030</u>

The Committee on Urban Development, Housing and Land Management (CUDHLM) works to promote:

- Affordable, adequate, climate-neutral housing, including for those with special needs and vulnerable population groups
- Compact, inclusive, circular, resilient, smart and sustainable cities
- Transparent and efficient land use, and property registration

The UNECE Housing and Land Management Unit is a secretariat to the <u>UNECE</u> <u>Committee on Urban Development, Housing and Land Management</u> and its Working Party on Land Administration (WPLA), the Real Estate Market Advisory Group (REM) and the Forum of Mayors.





UNECE: Working Party on Land Administration (WPLA)

- The Working Party on Land Administration aims to improve land administration and management in the UNECE region, enhancing security of tenure and promoting sustainable land use.
- It focuses on modernizing land administration systems, supporting policy formulation, and ensuring effective management and use of geospatial and real property data.
- The group fosters collaboration among member states through seminars, workshops, studies, and providing expert advice to promote best practices and policy development.





13th Session of WPLA April 4-5, 2023

- The 13th Session of WPLA, held on April 4-5, 2023 at the Palais des Nations in Geneva, Switzerland, served as an international forum for discussing land administration and management, where officials elected leadership and reviewed ongoing programs.
- The session reviewed the implementation of the WPLA's work since 2021, outlined the program for 2024-2025, and approved the draft Terms of Reference for 2025-2030.
- Discussions at the session also addressed major global trends affecting land administration, including ecosystem challenges and security, the impact of accelerated digitalization, and the future role of land administration in sustainable development and property rights security.







- 25 April and 22 February 2024
- Cyber Security. Challenges of Cyber Security in Digital Land Administration:
 - The webinars explored the impact of global megatrends and digitalization on land administration, discussing the shift to digital formats and its associated risks, such as data privacy and social stability. It highlighted strategies to mitigate these risks and strengthen security in the evolving digital landscape of land administration.
- 18 April 2024
- <u>Ecosystem in Land Administration: How are land and cadastral authorities working with new ecosystems in</u> <u>land administration?</u>
 - webinar examined the increasingly complex interplay between ecosystems and security in land administration, highlighting the role of global trends and sector-specific drivers in shaping collaborative ecosystems and distributed functions through public-private partnerships and online services, with implications for national and global land administration policies.



Workshop "Ensuring tenure security after natural and man-made disasters"

• 02 - 03 November 2023 Madrid Spain

The UNECE workshop in collaboration with the Spanish Land and Business Registrars Association, focused on securing land and housing tenure after natural and man-made disasters, discussing legal, geospatial, and economic strategies. The event also explored the integration of geospatial and legal information to enhance property ownership records and discussed the promotion of digital solutions for sustainable urban development and the regularization of informal settlements.

Ongoing Study on Ecosystem and Security in Land Administration

- The UNECE Working Party on Land Administration (WPLA) addresses global megatrends such as urbanization, climate change, and ICT advancements, focusing on optimizing land use and governance to maximize societal benefits.
- Enhanced by public-private partnerships and digital services, the WPLA promotes integrated approaches to land administration, including cadastre, land registration, and urban planning, to support the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- Future initiatives aim to strengthen land administration ecosystems through strategic, transparent, and cooperative frameworks that align with the 2030 Agenda, enhancing security, efficiency, and sustainability in managing land rights and responsibilities.



Study on Fraud in Land Administration Systems October 2021

- This publication updates the 2011 "Study on the Challenges of Fraud to Land Administration Institutions" and analyzes current practices in combating fraud in land administration systems across the ECE region.
- It highlights best practices in detecting and preventing fraud, especially important due to the public electronic accessibility of land and owner information.
- The study identifies key areas such as system accessibility, experiences of fraud, and countermeasures, recommending stronger internal controls, checks, and sanctions to effectively prevent and deter fraud.





Public-Private Partnership in Land Administration October 2021

- This publication updates the 2005 study on "Guiding Principles for Public-Private Partnership in Land Administration," evaluating current practices and principles of public-private partnerships in the field.
- It helps land administration authorities by outlining best practices from ECE member states and assisting in the development of future strategies.





<u>Scenario Study on Future Land Administration in the UNECE Region</u> November 2021

- Decision makers in land administration require a comprehensive understanding of emerging issues and developments predicted to impact the sector's future.
- WPLA has developed scenarios for future land administration and management solutions.
- This study explores future scenarios for the sector, considering the significance and expected impacts of global megatrends and specific drivers related to land administration.

Digital transformation and land administration 2022

- The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated the digital transformation of land administration, increasing the adoption of online services and remote work, along with greater demand for tenure information.
- This publication jointly edited with FAO and FIG examines how land administration systems, particularly in the UNECE region, responded to pandemic challenges, emphasizing the need for digital solutions to ensure sustainability and responsiveness.

Sustainable Development and Security of Property Rights in the UNECE Region - 2022

- The WPLA, in partnership with the Overseas Development Institute and Global Land Alliance, produced a report assessing perceived tenure security for land and housing in the UNECE region, using data from the Property Rights Index.
- The report examines issues like unequal housing, informal land use, housing market rigidity, and property rights restitution, offering insights for strengthening property security through government policy and advocacy.
- Its conclusions support UNECE's efforts to achieve urban and land-related Sustainablea Development Goals and align with the New Urban Agenda and the Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing.







The Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing

The Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing is a non-legally binding document that aims to support member States as they seek to ensure access to decent, adequate, affordable and healthy housing for all. The Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing was endorsed by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe on 16 April 2015

- Chapter 1: Challenges to sustainable housing
- Chapter 2: Goal, Scope and Principles
 - (a) Environmental protection
 - (b) Economic effectiveness
 - (c) Social inclusion and participation
 - (d) Cultural adequacy
- Chapter 3: Key directions of work and measures to promote sustainable housing

(a) Limit the negative impact of housing on the environment and enhance the energy efficiency of the housing sector

(b) Promote access to housing in the context of sustainable economic development

(c) Promote decent, adequate, healthy, barrier free and safe housing

(d) Promote the continued application of sustainable housing principles
