







Demand for land and land values do not significantly increase; cocoa prices do not decrease to the point of cocoa farming being unviable; extreme weather events, disease or pests do not prevent cocoa farm rehabilitation; and there is political will to put land use plans into effect

Theory of Change for Environmental Restoration and Land Governance in Cacao Landscapes


N.B.: Theory of Change similar for actors in Madagascar Sambirano Valley




Location of Major Resource Tenure «Wounds » in Sambirano

#4 - Protected Area Entities: (Special Status): Tsaratanana,



Policy Responses to Major Resource Tenure « Wounds » in

#1 - Private Sector:

Colonial legacy disputes with surrounding farmers around unfulfilled promises on Titled Private Property (PPT) and some squatter occupation.

Resolution Processes : Work through Services Domaniaux and Courts

2 - Producers: Ambiguous ownership of land in category of Non-Titled Private Property (PPNT)

Resolution Processes : Support Commune PLOF and Guichets Fonciers, WB CASEF technical assistance to 8 communes: new ProPFR project.

3 - Squatters on State Lands: Occupants of ex-Indigenous Reserves and other locations (and also FOFIA station, forest reserves, schools)

Resolution Processes :

Promote Opération Domainial Concertée (ODOC) and prepare initiatives with Forestry Service.


#4 - Protected Area Entities: Madagascar National Parks (Special Status):

Resolution Processes: Reinforce Madagascar National Parks through strengthening implementation of park plans and explore new forms of climate smart agriculture within selected parts of protected areas.

Cacao Farm Rehabilitation

"The Stool bought a cabinet to store the documents, the palace has a copy. We bring out these documents when there are disputes." – Queen Mother Nana Akua Asamoah I, Asankrangwa

"The land documentation was helpful to farmers. They helped with difficulties between the tenant and landlord. They have promoted unity. If the tenant's trees are overgrown, they now discuss and pay the landlord a token, and then they are ready to go. Now shade trees are protecting our cocoa from the sun. Both landlord and *abunu* are now one." – Chief of Yirase

"The documentation is working. Only when a tenant doesn't tell the landlord about rehabilitation is there an issue. If they go by the documents, it is easier." – Chief of Yirase

"If any farmer/landlower has not signed a document, their personal relationship is not good. If the relationship is not good, the documents will not work." - Chief of Yirase


"There have been no disputes since there is documentation as to ownership and responsibilities. If issues arise, they have documents, and it is easily resolved." – Regional Chief of Kwabeng (woman)

"This process has brought more unity between tenant and landowners. Any discussion is now easier. It is now easier for the tenant and the landowner to communicate on land issues." – Palace spokesperson and chief farmer, Nyame Nnae










Scenarii pour l'utilisation des terres dans la zone d'intérêt




