



Representatives from the ministries responsible for land in each of the IGAD 8 member states together with representation from Civil Society Organizations. Implement through ministries as IGAD works with government.










THE GENESIS

YOUTH AND LAND GOVERNANCE STRATEGY

2020-2025

IGAD prioritizes the following issues in the implementation of the AU Declaration on land issues and challenges in Africa.

- ➤ Land and natural resources degradation.
- ➤ Land governance and migration.
- ➤ Land tenure insecurity and land administration challenges.
- > Land and conflict.
- ➤ Weak rights to land of youth, women, pastoralists and other vulnerable groups.



Rights of youth to access, utilize and control land for their benefit and that of future generations are fully recognized and acted upon. Youth are empowered through participation in land policy, planning, decision-making and implementation processes as well as strong partnerships with all stakeholders involved.



To support the realization of this vision through enabling IGAD Secretariat, member states and stakeholders to act to sustain and/or create enabling conditions supportive of youth mainstreaming into land governance for the attainment of positive development outcomes.

IGAD Youth and Land Program (Who we are)


- A diverse and talented steering committee of youth across the IGAD Member states (Uganda, Djibouti, Eriteria, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan and Sudan)
- This initiative champions the active involvement of young people in the discourse on land governance
- Born against the backdrop of an increasing age and gender gap in the land policymaking spaces across the Horn of Africa—a region beset by environmental and socio-economic challenges.
- Since inception in 2019, it has been the beacon of empowerment and opportunity for young people across the region.
- Designed to address critical intersection of youth engagement and land rights
- This initiative stands as a testament to IGAD's commitment to fostering sustainable development and Inclusive land governance.







Why Community of Practice?





- Many programs focus on empowering communities and reducing land and environmental conflicts.
- Serves as a vibrant platform facilitating key activities aimed at broadening access to land dialogue spaces, showcasing specialized capabilities, and enhancing shared experiences among peers throughout the IGAD region.
- In 2022, we organized regional workshops designed to introduce cutedging land technologies to youth officers in targeted government ministries and departments within the IGAD region.
- Our aim was to develop a model for institutions like IGAD to prioritize youth participation in enhancing land governance policies, such as dispute resolution and leveraging land as a means of investment and empowerment.





Why Community of Practice (Cont'd)

- The theme of these workshops was "Wednesdays for Youth and Land".
- The steering committee successfully advocated for a Ministerial directive ensuring participation was exclusively for youth professionals aged 35 and under.
- This directive was crucial in providing a safe space for young voices to express their constraints and to explore opportunities where they could apply their talents. To support seamless technological integration and develop pragmatic solutions to enduring challenges that continue to challenge our leadership.






Outcomes of community of practice workshops

Centralized at the IGAD secretariat

The development of a strategic model

To establish a multitalented monitoring group (the steering committee) aimed at enhancing shared knowledge and fostering youth innovation in land discussions.







Outcomes of community of practice workshops (Cont'd)



- Enhanced communication strategies to bridge the mentorship gap, including spotlight blogs for young professionals, particularly those in government who have led special initiatives.

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
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


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
